

If you have suffered verbal or physical abuse because of your faith, then it is vital that you report it to the Police and the CST.

If the Police are made aware of all antisemitic incidents, as well as targeting offenders, they will be able to structure local patrols in a more informed manner and provide reassurance for the Jewish community as a whole.

The Metropolitan Police Service is committed to
ensuring that the Jewish community can go about its
daily life in safety and without fear.

In Barnet, local Safer Neighbourhoods Teams,
in partnership with the Community Security Trust,
now provide dedicated patrols on Shabbat. These
patrols allow officers to visit synagogues and provide
reassurance and support to the community.

These Shabbat patrols also give local officers an
opportunity to gain a better understanding of the Jewish
faith, as well as the particular problems faced by
observant Jews when attempting to combat and report
crime on Shabbat and Yom Tovim.

For example, the Police understand the difficulties in
reporting incidents during shabbat. Whilst it is preferable
to deal with matters immediately, officers will understand
if you report the incident the next day.
